

World Rabies Day Poster Competition 2023

On World Rabies Day this past fall, the Kansas State Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory (KSVDL) at Kansas State University (KSU) and the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) in collaboration with Bavarian Nordic and the One Health Commission Bat Rabies Education Team (BRET) hosted a poster contest to educate children about rabies prevention in Kansas.

All students in grades K-12 were eligible to participate in the poster competition to design an eye-catching and informative poster that shared information about rabies, how it's transmitted and how to prevent it. The 2023 theme was "All for 1. One Health for All," which calls out the role that One Health plays in the prevention of rabies in humans and animals.

One Health is the concept that the health of people, animals, plants and our shared environment are all connected, and to solve complex health issues, we must look at all domains in the One Health triad. In rabies for example, we emphasize vaccinating domestic animals (which indirectly protects people) and not touching wildlife (which protects wildlife, people and pets).

Winning Posters







