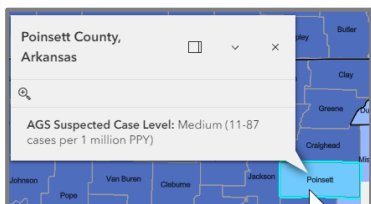


HOW DO I USE THE MAP?

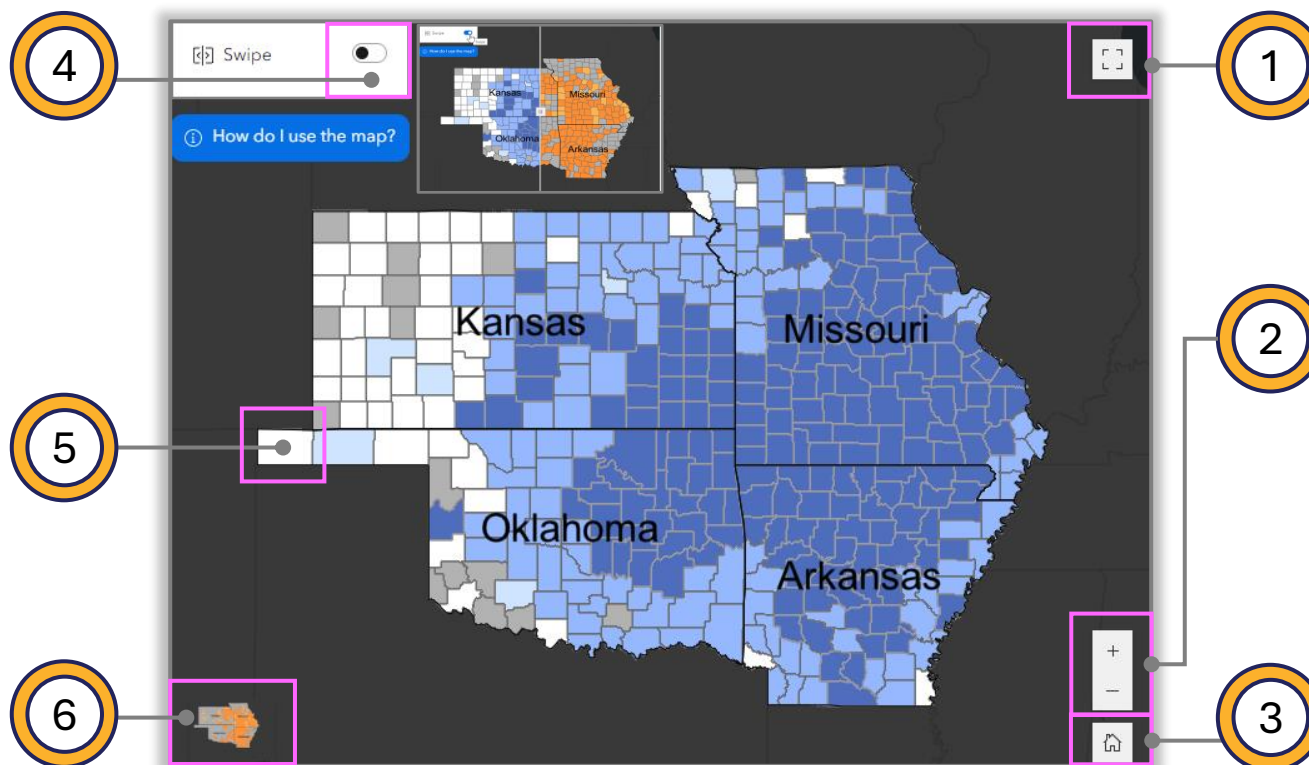
The following document highlights the map features that are available to help individuals explore the relationship between suspected cases of alpha-gal syndrome (AGS) and the population status of the lone star tick (*A. americanum*) for the Midwest '4 corners' region of the United States.

Click the toggle button in the upper left-hand corner to activate the **swipe** feature (inset). This feature allows the user to compare between maps without switching between layers. Click and hold the grey square to move the swipe bar back and forth.



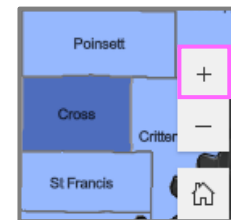
To activate the **pop-up** feature, simply click the county you are interested in. Pop-ups are not available when the swipe feature is activated.

Click the small map icon in the bottom left-hand corner to **switch between maps**. The blue map represents the geographic distribution of suspected AGS cases, while the orange map represents the population status of the lone star tick (*A. americanum*).



Having trouble seeing the map's features? Click this button to make the map **full screen**. To exit full screen mode, hit the escape button.

Use these buttons to **zoom in** (+) or **zoom out** (-) on the map. County names will become visible once the map is zoomed in far enough.



To return to the map's **original extent**, click the home button.
