Rabies Testing

- The Kansas State University Rabies Laboratory conducts animal rabies testing.
- Call the KSU Rabies Lab prior to submission of samples at 785-532-4483.
- Laboratory confirmed rabid animals are immediately reported to the Kansas
 Department of Health and Environment and Infectious Disease Epidemiology and
 Response Section.
- A follow –up investigation is conducted for each case and includes evaluation of people and animals in contact with the rabid animal to determine if rabies postexposure prophylaxis is needed.
- It is important to follow all protocol and best practices for sample submission to ensure accurate testing can be conducted.
- The local health officer makes the determination on the location of either the 10 day observation of a dog or cat that bites a human or the quarantine location of a pet (or other animal) that has been bitten by a rabid animal. This information can be found in the Kansas Administrative Regulation on Rabies Control (K.A.R. 28-1-13).
